

## Making Our Village Beautiful

I have sown the perennials for next year and will be nurturing them through the winter months so that they will flourish in the garden next year. I am sure that a few will be left over to sell at the car show in May, if anyone is interested in buying some. Remember that if you have any spare plants or bulbs, we would appreciate them at any time of the year. Those that we cannot use in the displays, we can sell to fund our activities.

The Feltwell in Bloom group were very busy during October. Four new tubs have been placed around the village – have you seen them? We have re-planted the Queen Elizabeth II roses into tubs now at the entrance to Newcombe Drive. Hopefully these will survive the mowers! We have also placed tubs at the entrance to Hereward Way. These have been planted with bulbs and winter flowering plants. We have cleared and planted all of the other tubs around the village, also with bulbs and winter flowering plants. 

For a rural area very little, if anything, on the chart above is surprising but it does highlight the difference between rural and urban living in terms of transport options.










Well, dear readers, there has not been a lot of excitement here in Worcestershire since the last Deannie's probate article. done, most of her assets have been credited to the executors' account and I have distributed the funds to our children and grandchildren. During nearly 50 years as a GP, I came across many instances where a wife died and husband would the not let touch her clothes anyone preserving them as a comfort in his grief. Eventually, perhaps 10 or 15 years later, the clothes would be useless, dusty and moth -ridden, fit only for the dustbin. Those of you who knew Deannie remember will her fantastic clothes, purchased over many years and carefully maintained. Oranges and reds dominated (We had an orange theme at her funeral and at the Methwold memorial service) and she always looked lovely. So, mindful of my comments above, I had to bite the bullet and move her clothes on. This turned out to be one of

the most emotionally traumatic events since her death.

Daughters Alyson and Charlotte plucked up courage and came over for a day. We sorted out all the "posh" clothes and put them aside. The 'lesser' clothes were amalgamated into large packages for women's hostels (refuges). The girls tried to put themselves into the shoes of those who were having to seek refuge and carefully mixed tops, underwear, night wear, trousers, socks and so on with unused cosmetics, nice soaps, shoes, handbags and all sorts of stuff which they thought would be appreciated by people who had absolutely nothing. All the family had looked at the shoes and, many of those had found a good home with granddaughters.

All the refuge parcels were distributed by my "Active Seniors" exercise teacher and I was left with all the posh dresses and trousers. There is, just down the road, a wonderful Mary

### **LATEST CONSUMER ALERTS AND TRADING STANDARDS NEWS**

As scammers are very active at the moment there are more pages in this section than is usual. But I think it important that you are made aware.

#### Scam Alert – Employment scam messages

We are warning residents about scam messages claiming to be offering employment opportunities.

The messages, often sent by text or on WhatsApp involve a scammer impersonating an HR recruiter and luring victims in with promises of work that don't exist.

If contact is made the scammer will start by asking for personal information either a CV or they may send a questionnaire to complete, following this the scammer may ask for fees to be paid to cover administration or travel.

Genuine recruiters shouldn't contact jobseekers in this way, so generally it's best to ignore tempting job offers sent via text or unexpected WhatsApp message. You can report suspicious text messages received by forwarding them to **7726**.

#### Scam Alert – Emails offering loans

We are warning residents to be wary of unexpected emails claiming to be offering loans.

Scammers often try and target people when looking to take out loans or may contact you unexpectedly offering money at very low interest rates.

But before giving the loan, they'll ask for an upfront payment as a deposit, administrative fee or insurance. They might claim it's because of issues like a bad credit history.

They'll often put pressure for the fee to be paid quickly via a bank transfer. Or they may ask for vouchers to be used, for example from Google Play, Amazon or Ebay. Scammers have even started asking for payments to be made via crypto exchanges.

Some scammers will claim that the fees are refundable but no matter what amounts are paid no loan will ever be given. You can report any suspicious email received by forwarding it to <a href="mailto:report@phishing.gov.uk">report@phishing.gov.uk</a>.

### Scam Alert – Scammers targeting WhatsApp groups

We are highlighting a warning from Action Fraud about large community and religious WhatsApp groups being targeted by scammers after they received 268 reports since January this year.

The fraud often begins when a member of the group receives a WhatsApp audio call from the fraudster, pretending, or claiming, to be a member of the group. This is done to gain the individual's trust, and often the scammer will use a false profile picture and/or display name, so at first glance it would appear to be a genuine member of the group.

The fraudster will then call the victim and say they are sending a one-time passcode which will allow them to join an upcoming video call for group members. The scammer

then asks the victim to share this passcode with them so they can be "registered" for the video call. What's really happening is that the scammer is asking for a registration code to register the victim's WhatsApp account to a new device where they then "port" their WhatsApp profile over.

Once the fraudster has access to the victim's WhatsApp account, they will enable twostep verification which makes it impossible for the victim to access their account. The scammer will then message other members of the group, or friends and family in the victim's contacts, asking them to transfer money urgently as they are in desperate need of help.

Analysis of Action Fraud reports indicate that victims targeted by this scam are often part of large WhatsApp community, alumni and academic, work groups, and religious groups (such as church or prayer groups).

What can you do to avoid being a victim?

Never share your account's two-factor authentication (2FA) code (that's the six digit code you receive via SMS)

Set up two-step verification to give an extra layer of protection to your account. Tap Settings > Account > Two-step verification > Enable

THINK. CALL. If a family member or friend makes an unusual request on WhatsApp, always call the person to confirm their identity

You can report spam messages or block a sender within WhatsApp. Press and hold on the message bubble, select 'Report' and then follow the instructions.

If you have been a victim of fraud or cybercrime, report it to Action Fraud by calling 0300 123 2040 or by visiting the Action Fraud website.

#### Scam Alert - Free electricity emails

We are highlighting a warning from Action Fraud after they received over 800 reports about emails circulating claiming to be from energy suppliers offering 'free' or cheap electricity.

The emails urge recipients to use the link provided to check if they are eligible for the offer.

These emails are fake, anyone clicking on the link will be taken to a phishing website which will attempt to gather personal and financial information as part of the 'check'.

#### Scam Alert - Fake DVLA Texts

We are warning residents about text messages which claim to be from DVLA.

The message states that as 'part of a routine check' you are required to confirm your 'driver's licence record'.

These text messages are not from DVLA, anyone clicking on the link will be taken to a fake version of the DVLA website which will attempt to gather personal and financial information.

You can report suspicious text messages received by forwarding them to 7726.

#### Scam Alert - Gift card scams

Gift card scams are where scammers trick people into purchasing gift cards and then providing them the information such as the card's code and PIN number.

Initial contact from the scammer can come through several different routes including letter, email, telephone cold call, text, or WhatsApp messages utilising a range of strategies including fake prize wins, unnecessary technical support, romance fraud, outstanding tax debts, and court case notifications to get the recipient to interact with them.

Once in communication the scammer will claim that an amount of money needs to be paid and this should be done by purchasing gift cards often for large amounts.

We offer the following advice to stay safe from gift card scams:

Always be wary of unexpected contacts, especially cold calls and messages

Don't be rushed, scammers will emphasise urgency to make people respond without time to think

Be wary of anyone insisting that payment is made by gift card, no real businesses, organisations or government agencies will ask for payment this way

Never provide numbers on a gift card to someone you do not know

Treat gift cards as carefully as you would cash

#### Scam Alert – Investment Scams and fake cryptocurrency exchanges

We are continuing to receive reports of individuals falling victim to online investment scams, including fake cryptocurrency exchanges. Losses to these scams range from a few hundred to several thousand pounds.

Bitcoin is the most famous cryptocurrency, but there are more than 1,500 cryptocurrencies including other well-known ones such as Ethereum and Litecoin. Cryptocurrencies only exists online and are not controlled by a bank, treasury or country meaning you can't get physical notes or coins from the bank.

Our advice is to always ensure you understand a cryptocurrency or an investment before transferring any money.

A cryptocurrency scam can take many forms, this could include:

- a fake cryptocurrency which doesn't or will ever exist
- a bogus investment which promises to put money in a legitimate cryptocurrency
- a dangerous website link that then downloads malware onto your computer

If you think you have received an investment offer that you believe is a scam or you have become a victim of a scam, you can report this to us via our partners the Citizens Advice consumer helpline on **freephone 0808 223 1133**.



Millions of households across the UK will receive £300 directly from the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) between 31 October and 19 November 2023. However, criminals are known to be targeting those who might be about to receive the money, trying to get money and personal details from them.

If you are eligible:

- You do not need to apply for the payment
- You do not need to call
- Payment to you is **automatic**
- DWP will never ask for personal details by text or email

The second payment of £300 will automatically be paid into eligible customers bank accounts between 31 October and 19 November. The payment reference for bank accounts will be the recipient's National Insurance Number followed by DWP COL or HMRC COLS.

#### Scam Alert – Fake DVLA emails

We are continuing to warn residents about fake communications which claim to be from DVLA.

One recent example shared with us states 'Our records show that you are not up to date with your current vehicle tax' and that 'This is your last (v11) reminder from us'. The email goes on to claim that 'Your Vehicle is not permitted to legally be on the road'

These emails are **not from DVLA**, anyone clicking on the link provided in the text will be taken to a fake version of the DVLA website which will attempt to gather personal and financial information.

#### Scam Alert – Fake emails offering 'free electric toothbrushes'

We are highlighting a warning from Action Fraud as they have now received more than 10,000 reports about emails circulating promising 'free Oral-B electric toothbrushes'.

The emails usually impersonate well know retailers such as Boots and claim that the recipient will receive their free toothbrush if they simply follow the links in the email and complete a feedback form.

These emails are **fake**, anyone clicking on the link will be taken to a phishing website which will attempt to gather personal and financial information.

You can report suspicious emails received to the National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC) by forwarding it to report@phishing.gov.uk

You can report suspicious text messages received by forwarding them to 7726.

You can also report other suspicious contacts received to us via our partners the Citizens Advice consumer helpline on freephone 0808 223 1133

The first scientific observation of circadian rhythm was made in 1729 by French scientist Jean-Jacques d'Ortous de Mairan. He conducted an experiment to distinguish an endogenous clock from responses to daily stimuli and noted that 24-hour patterns in the movement of the leaves of the plant Mimosa pudica persisted, even when the plants were kept in constant darkness

The existence of circadian rhythm was independently discovered in fruit flies in 1935 by two German zoologists, Hans Kalmus and Erwin Bünning. The 2017 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine was awarded to Jeffrey C. Hall, Michael Rosbash, and Michael W. Young for their discoveries of molecular mechanisms controlling the circadian rhythm



#### HARE COURSING UPDATE

When I am out and about people tell me it's going on yet our figures don't back this up. I would like to advise people if hare coursing is going on it is reported to us via 999, if the criminals have left or its seen later (damage) this is then reported via our online form so we have accurate records, trends and intelligence on the issue.

#### **PLANT MACHINERY THEFT**

We have seen a theft of high value plant machinery this month, can I again remind anyone that owns any sort of machinery, trailers or high value tools mark the property appropriately, attach trackers

where possible and have the serial numbers/photographs available should the worst happen. This can make a real difference in recovering stolen property, a little black book of your own property is an easy solution

#### **HOME SECURITY ADVICE**

Burglary and thefts tend to increase during the autumn months as the afternoons get darker, making it easier to identify unoccupied homes, which are often left unlit. Residents can make their homes more secure by following some basic crime prevention advice such as:

- Use timer switches on a lamp, radio or TV set so that they turn on as it gets dark in the afternoons.
- Make a habit of checking that ground floor windows and doors are closed and locked when you leave the house or go to bed.
   Upstairs windows should be locked when the house is unoccupied.
- PVC doors must be locked by lifting the handle and turning the key to ensure all the security features are in place.
- Car and house keys should be kept out of sight in a safe place.
   Don't leave them on display on windowsills, in porches, hallways or kitchens.

Secure your rear garden by shutting and locking any gates. Burglars can use garden tools, like ladders to break in, so make sure you securely lock away any tools after use

#### WHAT HAPPENED IN THE COUNTRYSIDE IN OCTOBER

With the weather as it was at the start of the month our arable farms were able to get next summer's crops in the ground. You will have seen farms harvesting sugar beet which is our only form of home-grown sugar so when you see British sugar in the supermarket it has come from those huge dirty looking bulbs.

Livestock farms were in full swing getting the final winter feed crop into the silage clamps. You may have seen tractors towing trailers of green shredded matter. This is maize, very similar to sweetcorn, but harvested at slightly lower moisture content and chopped up, placed into silage clamps like the summer grass to 'pickle' to preserve it as vital winter feed.

On the livestock farms many prepared for bringing stock in for the winter months but managed to get as much as possible out of the grass outside. Housing livestock for their welfare during winter is an expensive necessity. Feed and bedding do not come cheap and never more so than this year.

Most sheep will remain outdoors until lambing in the spring normally, however, many were preparing them for tupping season (mating). Its essential that the male sheep (tup or ram) is in top condition ahead of going in with the ewes as he is likely be asked to cover 30+ ewes very quickly. The ewes themselves also need to be in top condition to carry the lambs through the winter months. Some early lambing flocks started tupping, traditionally you put the tup in on the 5th of November for lambs to be born on the 1st of April however, with modern markets requiring lamb all year round some flocks have moved to earlier lambing making the product available for a longer period. You also tend to find pedigree pure bred sheep are lambed earlier, so they are much bigger for the show season which starts at the end of May.

As for our wildlife most, if not all, our summer visitors are long gone to warmer climates. That said, we still had some migratory birds that visit us from the North for a less harsh winter including many Geese. One of our most prolific species that appears is the Pink-Footed Geese, it arrives from Iceland and Greenland to spend winter here







Well, what if you could have both? Here I'll mention a few ways you can help the nature in your garden at a time of year when it is looking for hiding places to see out the harsh weather ahead.

Some people feel conflicted about their lawns, in particular- longer grass provides sheltered spots for insects, which in turn support beloved and beneficial mammals like Hedgehog and Wood mouse. Both will help to control garden 'pests' and you might find it easier to support them by leaving sweeping curves or oval patches of long grass in your lawn- that way the area still looks 'maintained' but you benefit wildlife too. Many butterfly caterpillars, such as Meadow brown, Ringlet and Small skipper overwinter inside living grass stems and at the base of upright tussocks. So you'll be helping boost your local butterfly numbers for the next year, too.

Another task on the gardener's list at this time of year is to gather up fallen leaves, especially from paths, so that it's less of a slip risk. However, instead of putting these into your brown bin, it's better for wildlife if you can keep them in your garden- for example, by piling them up underneath hedges and shrubs. Queen bumblebees hibernate in a shallow tunnel underneath a layer of dry leaves so you'd be helping them survive the winter to start new colonies in the Spring. Also, dead leaves are food for a range of bugs including woodlice and earthworms, which are vital food for our garden birds like Blackbirds, Robins and the enchanting little Wren (pictured over). Hedgehogs and shrews depend on bugs to eat, too.

After the long, warm summer months (and a good amount of rain this year) our shrubs and trees tend to have put on a lot of woody growth and many of us want to trim them back. With the material you collect, why not make a wood pile? They can look really attractive assembled within a flowerbed, or even in a lawn with the grass allowed to grow long around it- and as the wood begins to break down, colourful fungi often pop up and beetles move in underneath the pile. Not to

mention toads and newts, who love to hibernate in a damp, cool spot. Both of these species will have slugs and snails at the top of their list of favourite foods, so you'll be helping give your seedlings a better chance of surviving next Spring!

CATS

The law is changing regarding some treatments available from the vets. The new guidelines mean that the vet can only prescribe antimicrobials,

including antibiotics, antivirals and antifungals as well as flea and worm treatment at the same time as a clinical examination by a vet, so an appointment may be needed where it wasn't previously. It also applies to certain other prescription medication, including anti-epilepsy medication and some pain relief. The vets offer free flea and worm check appointments providing there are no other issues regarding your cat, therefore there is no extra cost to the client because of this change.

Flea and worm treatment is weight related, which means the vet will weigh your cat to make sure he is being given the correct dose. Some treatments also work on ticks as well. If your cat regularly picks up ticks, its best of make sure the flea and worm treatment works on ticks as well.

With the warm weather it is still important to keep treating your cats for fleas, and the best treatment which is guaranteed to work is to buy the products from the vets. It can be expensive, but worth it in the long run, as you can buy products at other outlets or on line, but with no guarantee that it will work. If you have fleas in your home, it is very difficult to get rid of them, as they can live in the carpet for long periods and leap onto you or your cat as you walk past. When you have your heating on in the winter, it is an ideal environment for fleas to live and reproduce.

Other items you may buy from the vets, such as certain foods, are not affected by the new law.

We offer help with the cost of neutering your cat. £50 towards the cost of neutering a male cat and £70 towards the cost of neutering a female cat. The voucher can be taken to any vet. Please call the number below if you need help.




